Night Moves: After- Dark Images

Through Jan 9, 2011

Artwork that celebrates nighttime themes including astronomy, lightning, and nocturnal plants and animals.

Contemporary Native American Art

Dec 9, 2011 - Jan 25, 2011

A group exhibition of Native American artists weaving together elements of their strong cultural heritage with a contemporary artistic aesthetic.

Family Ties

Jan 13 – Apr 3, 2011

Reception: Thurs, Jan 13, 5:30-7:30pm

Artwork by artists of the region who are related – husband/wife, father/son, sister/brother, grandmother/granddaughter, etc., showing how their relationships and perceptions inform and influence their own personal art visions.

Mary Lou Williams

Jan 27 – Mar 15, 2011

Tucson artist Mary Lou Williams creates bold, hand-painted linoleum block prints to make endearing statements about the landscape, lifestyle and people of the Southwest and Mexico.

Out in the Open: The Art of Plein Air

Mar 17- Apr 26, 2011

The remarkable light, shadow and atmospheric effects of the Southwest are intriguing to Plein air artists who try to capture it in paintings created outdoors. Working with the Tucson Plein Air Society, an indoor exhibition and outdoor “Paint Out” at the park will offer visitors the opportunity to meet artists and see their work in progress on park grounds.

Pattern/Rhythm

Apr 7 – June 19, 2011

Reception: Thurs, Apr 7, 5:30-7:30pm

An exhibition focusing on the wealth of visual patterns found in nature, as well as the rhythms inherent in the natural world, such as the lunar phases and seasonal changes. Featuring abstract nature photography, painting, fiber arts, and other media exploring these themes.

Congressional Student Art Exhibition

Apr 28 – May 17, 2011

A juried exhibition of award-winning artworks created by high school students from the 8th Congressional District including all of Cochise and parts of Santa Cruz and Pima counties.

Art and Photography of the iPhone/Cell Phone

May 19 – July 12, 2011

Technology is changing the techniques that artists use to create works of art and cell phones are one of the newest implements in their 21st century toolbox. Our exhibit will feature images taken with a cell phone camera or art created on a cell phone.

As part of the Cell Phone photography exhibit, visitors will be encouraged to submit their own artworks during the exhibit – to be displayed on an art bulletin board or digital photo frame.

Book-sized or pocket-sized art journals are visual and personal journeys incorporating artistic images along with an artist’s thoughts, ideas, musing and impressions within layers of pages. We will invite several artists to share their own personal art journals for our exhibit.

Reception: Thurs, Nov 10, 5:30-7:30pm

Artists explore glyphs, letterforms, the art of language, quotes and the power of words within visual expressions.
